- The average American creates 4.5 pounds of trash per day. Up to 80% of this could have been recycled or composted.
- 140 million aluminum cans are wasted in the USA each day. Replacing them is polluting and damaging to the wilderness.
- Annually, enough energy is saved by steel recycling to supply Los Angeles with electricity for almost 10 years.
- Americans throw away enough office and writing paper every year to build a wall 12 feet high stretching from Los Angeles to New York City. Paper production and waste is the third leading cause of global warming.
- If everyone in the U.S. recycled 1/10th of their newsprint, we would save the equivalent of 25 million trees annually.
- Americans use over 3 million plastic bottles every hour. Less than 10% are recycled.
- The energy used to produce one day's junk mail in America is enough to heat 250,000 homes.

Aluminum: Cans only No foil or pie plates

Glass: Separate by color - Brown, Green or Clear.

Blue can go with green. No caps, please!

Cardboard: Corrugated cardboard only.

No cereal box material, waxed/plastic coated corrugated boxes. Remove packing material.

White /Mixed Paper: Copy, computer, laser computer, notebook papers, business forms, bills and stationary are all acceptable. Remove staples if possible and all other

metal. No stickers, adhesives, envelopes, file folders,

binders, carbons, construction or colored paper,

newspaper, junk mail or paper with more than 30%

colored ink. Colored ledger paper, envelopes (white or

colored), carbonless paper, pamphlets and brochures,

opened and sorted direct mailings. No glossy material.

Steel (TIN cans): Rinse cans, remove one end, put

inside can & flatten. Avoid loose ends if possible.

Plastic: Plastic marked #1—#7. Please rinse

container; as always, no caps. No plastic bags.

Newspaper: Newsprint and inserts. (If it came with the

paper, it can be recycled with it). Catalogues cannot be

accepted.

Keep recycling alive in Moab.
