Use both sides of a piece of paper before recycling it. Buy products made from recycled material. Start a recycle center at your shop or office. Encourage friends to recycle. Aluminum: Cans only No foil or pie plates
Glass: Separate by color - Brown, Green or Clear. Blue can go with green. No caps, please!
Cardboard: Corrugated cardboard only. No cereal box material, waxed/plastic coated corrugated boxes. Remove packing material.
Paper: Copy, computer, laser computer, notebook paper, business forms, bills, stationary, colored ledger paper, envelopes (white or colored), carbonless paper, pamphlets and brochures, **opened** and sorted direct mailings. No glossy material.
Steel (TIN cans): Rinse cans, remove one end, put inside can & flatten. Avoid loose ends if possible.
Plastic: Plastic marked #1—# 7. Please empty/lightly rinse container; no caps. No plastic bags.
Newspaper: Newsprint and inserts. (If it came with the paper, it can be recycled with it).
